LAS VEGAS HISTORY

In 1905 the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake railroad arrived in Las Vegas, connecting the city with the Pacific and the country's main rail networks. The future downtown was platted and auctioned by railroad company backers, and Las Vegas was incorporated in 1911.

Nevada outlawed gambling in 1910 but the practice continued in speakeasies and illicit casinos. By the time gambling was legalized again in 1931, organized crime already had roots in the city.

In 1931 construction began on the massive Boulder Dam (later renamed the Hoover Dam), drawing thousands of workers to a site just east of the city. Casinos and showgirl venues opened up on Fremont Street, the town's sole paved road, to attract the project's workers. When the dam was completed in 1936, cheap hydroelectricity powered the flashing signs of Fremont's "Glitter Gulch."

In 1966 Howard Hughes ushered in the hotel era to the tune of—\$300 million worth—ushering in an era in which mob interests were displaced by corporate conglomerates.

In 1989 the Mirage marked the city's first mega-resort. Over the next two decades the strip was transformed yet again: Old casinos were dynamited to make room for massive complexes taking their aesthetic cues from ancient Rome and Egypt, Paris, Venice, New York and other glamorous escapes.

While tourism remains a staple of Las Vegas, economic growth is also happening throughout many other industries such as technology and education. Neighborhoods and corporate parks continue to flourish off the famous strip in parts of the valley away from the hustle and bustle of the city's many tourist attractions.



QUICK TIPS

IT'S A "DRY HEAT"

The Las Vegas Valley is comprised of nearly 600 square miles. While a dry heat dominates between April and August, spring and winter seasons are typically mild and pleasant. Desert winds are sometimes prevalent and summer temperatures can reach as high as 120 degrees, but there is very little humidity. This ideal climate promotes plenty of outdoor activities ranging from golf and tennis to skiing, swimming, hiking and boating.

CARING FOR PETS IN THE DESERT

Pets need special care when adapting to and living in a desert climate. Limit the amount of time your animals spend outside during the hottest parts of day and always provide plenty of fresh water and shade. Remember your pets' sensitive foot pads, which can easily burn on hot concrete or dirt during the hottest times of day.

PET LICENSING

Licenses are required for all dogs and cats in Clark County. Residents are limited to three adult dogs and three adult cats per household. You may have up to six dogs and cats if you obtain a special pet fancier's license.

Both dogs and cats must be restrained by a leash. All dogs and cats must have rabies shots every two years.

GETTING AROUND LAS VEGAS

Driving in Nevada:

You must be a Nevada resident and provide a Nevada street address to obtain a driver license. You may not hold licenses or ID cards from multiple states.

Active duty military members, their spouses, dependents and others living temporarily in Nevada are not required to transfer their license and registration.

Licenses are not issued to visitors. Foreign nationals may or may not be eligible for a license or a driver authorization card depending on their specific immigration status.

Documents needed to register a new vehicle include originals of the following:

- Most recent registration
- Out of State Plates
- Nevada Emissions Vehicle Inspection Report
- Smog check if needed
- Nevada Proof of Insurance
- Nevada Vehicle inspection certificate (VIN Check)

Ways To Ride:

- **The monorail** stops at seven points on the Las Vegas Strip: MGM Grand, Bally's/Paris, Flamingo/Caesars Palace, Harrah's/The LINQ, the Las Vegas Convention Center, Westgate and SLS Las Vegas.
- **Taxis** are the main form of transportation used throughout Vegas. There is an abundance of them all over the city and, most likely, always a few waiting within a taxi line at a hotel during all hours of the day and night.
- **The Deuce** is the name of Las Vegas' form of public transportation that's operated by the Regional Transportation Committee. While the bus runs throughout town, there are two routes you can specifically take for the Strip and Downtown. These are Deuce on the Strip, which will stop at about every property on the Strip, and SDX Strip & Downtown Express, which stops at about half the stops as the other route.
- **Uber and Lyft** are now legal means of transportation throughout the city. For those unfamiliar with them, they're both forms of riding-sharing apps where drivers will pick you up in their personal car and transport you to your destination.

COMMUNITIES

LAS VEGAS

While Las Vegas has always been revered for its exciting nightlife, upscale dining, retail and entertainment offerings have taken the city to a new level. Las Vegas is also coming into its own with the expansion of non-gaming industries, bringing high-tech companies, notable educational and medical research facilities and cultural arts offerings to the table.

HENDERSON

With a population estimated at more than 252,000, Henderson has evolved from a small suburb of Las Vegas into a flourishing community. Created for Basic Magnesium Inc.'s defense plants during World War II, Henderson is now home to award-winning master-planned communities, a revitalized downtown business hub and an array of parks, recreational facilities and dining and retail options.

NORTH LAS VEGAS

While some confuse North Las Vegas with the "northern part" of Las Vegas, this burgeoning area is an independent city unto itself. With a population of more than 200,000, several successful master-planned communities have fueled economic development in North Las Vegas by attracting new business and retail amenities to the area. A proactive city government has led the way in creating a technology hub in the area. The city is home to the bulk of Southern Nevada's manufacturing, technology, distribution and industrial facilities.

SOUTH/SOUTHEAST VALLEY

This sprawling area of the valley is home to both established neighborhoods and some of the area's most popular master-planned and retirement communities. It also features popular entertainment options including the District at Green Valley Ranch, the Henderson Parks and Recreation Department's Multigenerational Center and Outdoor Amphitheater.

Southeast Las Vegas is home to several new elementary, middle and high schools and has easy access to other areas of the valley through convenient access to Interstate 215 and U.S. Highway 95. The area is within close proximity to the Lake Mead National Recreation Area, Boulder City and Hoover Dam. Some of the valley's southeast communities include Anthem, Green Valley Ranch, Lake Las Vegas and Seven Hills.

NORTH/NORTHWEST VALLEY

Most locals refer to the entire northwestern portion of Las Vegas as "Summerlin," the award-winning Howard Hughes master-planned community that established this region of the valley. However, this area has grown to include an abundance of residential amenities, including upscale dining, shopping and recreational opportunities. Summerlin is still a mainstay of the region, but housing options now range from condominiums and age-restricted communities to elite guard-gated custom homes.

The valley's largest assemblage of golf courses can be found in the northwest. Courses include the Badlands, Painted Desert, Los Prados and Angel Park. Shopping options include the Meadows Mall, Boca Park and the Sahara Pavilion Oasis, as well as a number of trendy strip centers. Several neighborhood casinos, such as Santa Fe Station, Suncoast, Fiesta Rancho, Texas Station and Red Rock Resort offer fine dining and gaming. Select neighborhoods in the northwest valley include Centennial Village, Desert Shores and Queensridge.

GOLF COURSE COMMUNITIES

THE CANYONS AT SUMMERLIN

This upscale golf course village provides housing ranging from multi-family luxury apartments and single-family homes to executive estates and custom mansions. Designed around the championship TPC (Tournament Players Club) Las Vegas, residents enjoy spectacular views of the golf course and the adjacent Red Rock Conservation Area.

TPC SUMMERLIN

This guard-gated golf course community includes oversized home lots, golf course frontage and a variety of upscale housing options, ranging from luxury town homes to multimillion dollar custom estates. Residents enjoy access to the TPC Summerlin golf course, which was designed with the input of golf legend "Fuzzy" Zoeller, and the TPC Clubhouse, a private facility with a restaurant, lounge, swimming pools and sports courts.

NORTH/NORTHEAST LAS VEGAS

Northeast Las Vegas has become home to several significant master-planned communities over the past several years. Notable neighborhoods in the northeast valley include Aliante and Eldorado.

MEDICAL SERVICES

ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTS

Accountability Reports furnished each spring to parents include statistics about a school's performance as well as achievements, highlights, awards, goals and technology use. Accountability Reports are available online from the Clark County School District's web site at www.ccsd.net on the "Schools" link then on School Accountability Reports.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

Nevada law requires school attendance between ages 7 and 18. Kindergarten is part of the regular school program. A child must be five years old on or before September 30 to attend kindergarten and must be six years old on or before September 30 to enter first grade. State law requires that a child must attend a state-approved kindergarten program or take a developmental assessment test to enter first grade.

BUS SERVICES

Students who live more than 2 miles from zoned schools are eligible for bus transportation. Those who are eligible must fill out an application form requesting the service. The forms are available throughout the Clark County School District. Bus times and route schedules can be obtained through your child's school or at www.ccsd.net/transportation. Students with zone variances will NOT be bused. Parents will be responsible for the child's transportation to and from school.

MEALS AT SCHOOL

All schools give students the opportunity to purchase breakfast and hot lunches. Elementary schools average \$1.00 for breakfast and \$1.50 for lunches. Middle/High Schools average \$1.25 for breakfast and \$2.00, \$2.50 or \$3.00 for lunches. For students in kindergarten through the 8th grade, applications for free or reduced-price meals can be found at the school's office or cafeteria.

ENROLLMENT

In order to enroll students: Must have proof of immunizations before classes begin. Parents entering their children in a District School for the first time must have identification, child's social security number, and two forms of proof of address. Proof of child's identity can be the original birth certificate or passport. Identification must be an original – no copies are accepted. The required proof of address can be a recent utility bill, rent receipt, residence lease or sales contract. Telephone bills, cable bills, and driver's license are not accepted as proof of address. All students who are transferring from another school district require transcripts or report cards from the previous school.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Nevada law requires that children in kindergarten through grade 12 are current with their immunizations before they are allowed to enter school. Parents/guardians are to bring immunization records with them to school when they register their child. A child will not be allowed to attend school without documentation of immunizations. Exceptions are permitted for "religious objections," which requires a letter from the parent or guardian stating the religious objection, or for a medical condition, which requires a letter from a health care provider. For the new school year, students must be up to date with all required immunizations. Students entering 7th grade also must have the recently-mandated Tdap vaccine which protects against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis, or whooping cough. Students new to Nevada are required to have immunizations for hepatitis A and B, and varicella (chicken pox). If a child has had chicken pox, the parent or guardian must sign a "Verification of Disease" form, which is available at each school. A second dose of MMR is required for all kindergarten and first-grade students. Contact the Clark County Health District at 383-1351 for more information.

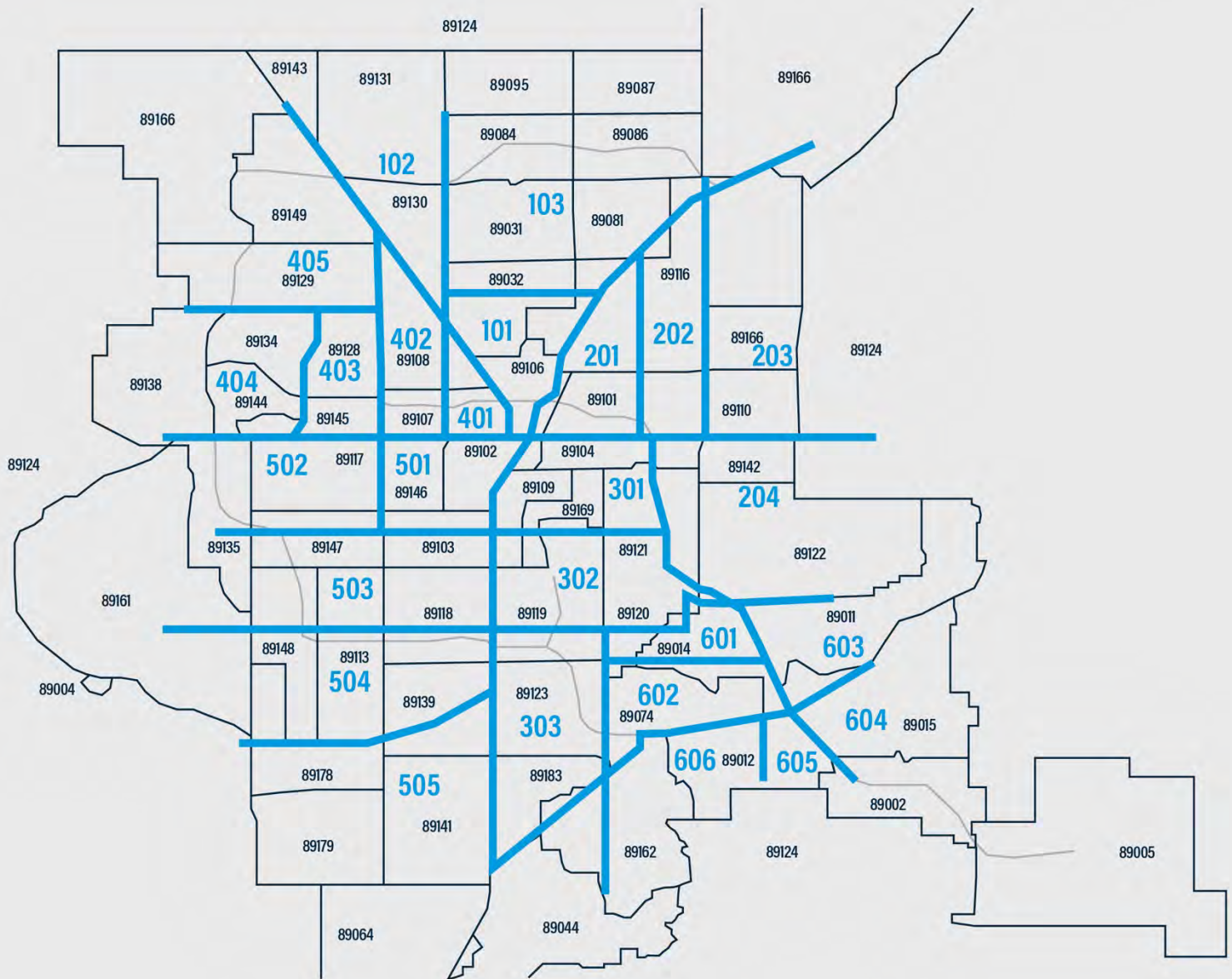

Here is some general tax information for Clark County & Nevada.

PERSONAL INCOME TAX

The Nevada Department of Taxation does not levy a state income tax.

SALES TAXES

The state sales tax in Nevada is 6.85%.

Sales tax in Clark County is 8.15%

INHERITANCE AND ESTATE TAXES

There is no inheritance tax in Nevada.

PROPERTY TAX DUE DATES

Tax rates are set in June of each year. Tax bills are prepared and mailed out by August 1st of each year. Property taxes are due on the third Monday in August. However, the property owner may elect to pay in installments if the taxes on a parcel exceed \$100.00.

Payments are made quarterly and as follows:

- 1st Quarter - 3rd Monday of August
- 2nd Quarter - 1st Monday of October
- 3rd Quarter - 1st Monday of January
- 4th Quarter - 1st Monday of March
